Program objectives

The purpose of this fund is to enable graduate students to attend high-level international schools (training camps, specialized summer/winter masterclasses) whose topics are consistent with Sentinel North's research program. Recognizing the value of such training, Sentinel North wishes through this program to foster the development of a new generation of young scientists able to tackle and help resolve complex northern issues, and encourage the sharing of knowledge and experience across borders.

More specifically, the program aims to encourage students to:

- Acquire new skills and abilities that help them understand and analyze northern issues and/or master technologies that have applications in the North;
- Establish international ties and networks by taking advantage of outstanding research opportunities.

Who it is for

Full-time Master's and Ph.D. students at Université Laval, working on a research project whose objectives are in line with those of Sentinel North's research program (starting from the second semester of their program).

Eligibility criteria

- Applicants must also meet all the following conditions to be eligible for the program:
- Propose a high-level training course whose objectives are in line with Sentinel North's research program as illustrated in its conceptual framework;
- Propose a training course provided by a host institution eligible for the program (see the Host institutions section for details);
- Propose a training activity lasting one to eight consecutive weeks;
- Have financial support in addition to Sentinel North's "Training Fund" to cover remaining expenses (20%).

To remain eligible for funding during their research study period abroad, applicants must maintain full-time student status in their graduate studies program at Université Laval.

Application procedure

You must send your application and all required documents listed below in one email to formation@sn.ulaval.ca. The subject of the message must begin with your last and first names, and clearly state the name of the program you are applying for.

- Your résumé (up to two pages);
- A copy of your university transcripts (including the program in progress);
- A letter of recommendation from your UL supervisor or co-supervisor justifying the relevance and added value of the proposed training activity to your academic progress and/or the acquisition of new skills;
- Proof of co-funding for the training activity (letter from your supervisor, award letter for additional funding, etc.);
- Proof of registration or an acceptance letter to take part in the training activity from the host institution;
- Detailed description of the training activity, including the names of scheduled speakers and hands-on activities.
